**What did English assess?**  
This tested comprehension and writing for 35 minutes. It was worth 38 marks overall.  
Section A of this paper tested comprehension skills. The questions were free response (no multiple choice) and needed one word answers while others needed to be answered in full sentences. Some questions asked a case question.  
Section B tested descriptive writing. Candidates were asked to write descriptively on a topic (for example suggesting ideas for what to write about on this topic. This was not a test of telling a story or creating a

**General skills:**

- Little written / not enough effort put into the writing
- Writing not clear enough (writing size, spacing between words)
- Generally wrote clearly and completed the story in the time allowed

**Comments:**

Your child needs to use quotation marks when asked for evidence from the text. He has missed the task in Section B and answered two questions instead of one.

**Mock Test Report - Maths**

Summer Report 1 -  
Pupils' **70%** of 40  
Year 6 Mock Test Score: **92.2%** (37/40)

**What did mathematics assess?**  
This was a written test, in which students had to read and answer 40 questions in 50 minutes. The marks for each question ranged from 1 to 5 marks. For questions with higher marks (3 - 5), students were awarded marks for their working out.  
The test assessed students' application of topics in mathematics and also their ability to present their work accurately.

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## 2. What is the format of the Mock Tests?

**Literacy & Numeracy Tests** are multiple choice style tests like the first stage eligibility exams at selective schools in Kingston and Sutton Boroughs.

**English & Maths Tests** assess English and Maths skills in a written format. These tests are designed to provide the best possible practice for the second stage exams at grammar schools and independent schools.

## 3. Who can take the Mock Tests?

It is strictly for students born between 1 Sept 2009 and 31 Aug 2010 (Year 6 from Sept 2020).

## 4. How many tests should my child take?

The Mock Tests have been designed to include various types of questions over all sets. By taking all tests, your child can familiarise and practice all kinds of questions.

## 5. Will I be able to see or keep the test papers?

No. The papers will not be released.

## 6. How will I receive the results?

A comprehensive report will be sent via email in the following week.

## 7. Can I reschedule a test if we are late or unable to attend?

Rescheduling is not permitted. Please login at least 15 minutes before the test.

## 8. Can I cancel and get a refund?

You can cancel by no later than 20 days before the test day (**£30 admin fee** will apply). If you are too late to cancel, no refunds will be given. Transferring your booking to another child is not allowed.
