What did English assess?
This tested comprehension and writing for 55 minutes. It was worth 38 marks overall.
Section A of this paper tested comprehension skills. The questions were free response (not multiple choice) and needed one word answers while others needed to be answered in full sentences. Some questions asked *own* questions.
Section B tested descriptive writing. Candidates were asked to write descriptively on a topic (for example suggesting ideas for what to write about on this topic). This was not a test of telling a story or creating a

General skills:

- Little written / not enough effort put into the writing
- Writing not clear enough (writing over, spacing between words)
- Generally wrote clearly and completed the story in the time allowed

Section A:

- They read some questions at comprehension in general and could understand the meaning of the passage
- Needs to give more detail when questions have more than one mark
- Needs to use questions from the passage more when asked for 'evidence' or 'with reference to the passage'
- Try to use own words more in answers, don't just repeat the text
- Needs to use paragraphs for longer answers (e.g. 4 mark questions)

Section B:

- Needs to spell or write in more interesting way
- Needs to use paragraphs to complete their writing
- Needs to take ideas on the amount of action / characters included and how an description
- Uses their own's description (e.g. descriptions including the five senses, sight, touch, smell etc.)
- Use more figurative language (e.g. similes and metaphors)
- Try to use the ideas suggested by the three bullet points under each topic
- Use sentences with different lengths (e.g. short sentences when there is a dramatic moment as an example)
- Try to use a wider range of vocabulary in your answers, do not just repeat the text
- Some words used incorrectly
- Keep your eyes on any grammatical mistakes
- Needs to make the use of different punctuation marks

Comments:
Your child needs to use quotation marks when asked for evidence from the text. He has missed the last 2 in Section B and answered two questions instead of one.

Mock Test Report - Maths

* If the student had given a mark, it is a maximum of 48. This means that the student received a score that is below the average score.

What did mathematics assess?
This was a written test, in which students had to work out and answer 48 questions in 50 minutes. The marks for each question ranged from 1 to 5 marks. For questions with higher marks (3 - 5), students were awarded marks for their working out.
The test assessed student's application of topics in mathematics and also their ability to present their work accurately.
