- You may not be able to finish the test, but answer as many questions as you can. If you are unsure of an answer, you should choose the answer you think is best.
- Do not spend a lot of time on a question if you find it very difficult. Instead, move on.
- Work as quickly and as carefully as you can.

Mock Test Report - English

Summary Report for

New Malden (Malden) Score: **73.3%** (36/48)
* If the student is not given a mark, it is shown as ' / out of 48'. This means that the student received a score that is below the average.

What did English assess?
This tested comprehension and writing for 55 minutes. It was worth 38 marks overall.
Section A of this paper tested comprehension skills. The questions were three response (one multiple choice, one short answer, one written answer) to be answered in full sentences. Some questions asked you to write a paragraph.
Section B tested descriptive writing. Candidates were asked to write descriptively on a topic (the exams suggesting ideas for what to write about on this topic. This was not a test of telling a story or creating a story).

General skills:

- Using evidence / not enough effort put into the writing
- Writing not clear enough (writing too, leaving between words)
- Generally write clearly and completed the story in the time allowed
- If a box is not ticked there was no evidence of this area being a problem for your child.

Section A

- May need more practice at comprehension in general as there's overall understanding of the passage
- Needs to give more detail when questions have more than one mark
- Needs to use quotations from the passage more often asked for 'evidence' or 'with reference to the passage'
- Try to use own words when it comes to short answer questions
- Needs to use paragraphs for longer answers (e.g. 4 mark questions)

Section B

- Needs to start or end in a more interesting way
- Needs to use paragraphs to organise their writing
- Needs to cut down on the amount of adjectives / adverbs included and focus on description
- Use more varied descriptions (e.g. adjectives including the five senses: sight, touch, smell etc.)
- Use more figurative language (e.g. simile and metaphor)
- Try to use the ideas suggested by the three bullet points under each topic
- Use sentences with different lengths (e.g. short sentences when there is a dramatic moment as in the passage)
- Try to use a wider range of vocabulary in your answers - do not just repeat the text
- Some words spell incorrectly
- Check your work on any grammatical mistakes
- Needs to review the use of relevant punctuation marks

Comments:
Your child needs to use quotation marks when asked for evidence from the text. He has missed the rule in Section B and answered two questions instead of one.

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Mock Test Report - Maths

Summary Report for
Sammy 7 out of 48
New Malden (Malden) Score: **92.2%** (44/48)
* If the student is not given a mark, it is shown as ' / out of 48'. This means that the student received a score that is below the average.

What did Mathematics assess?
This was a written test, in which students had to work out and answer 44 questions in 50 minutes. The marks for each question ranged from 1 to 5 marks. For questions with higher marks (3-5), students were awarded marks for their working out. The test assessed students' application of topics in mathematics and also their ability to present their work accurately.
